Report on Elizabeth's Funeral

DEATH OF MRS. S. E. TOZER.

The funeral took place last week of Mrs. S. E. Tozer, who died in a nursing home at Bath, aged 72 years. Widow of the Rev. J. Tozer, a former Rector of Dauntsey, she came to live at Christian Malford some eight years ago, and had taken an interest in the social life of the parish, being a member of the Women's Institute, Mothers' Union, and other organisations.

A Requiem Mass was held in the morning, and the burial service was conducted by the Rev. W. H. Barkwell, the lessons being read by the Rev. W. Cardwell, Rector of Little Somerford. Mrs. Wakefield was at the organ. The interment was in Dauntsey churchyard, in the same grave as that of Mr. Tozer, the committal sentences being read by the Rector of Dauntsey.
