Tact, energy and ability in dealing with boycotting in a disturbed district – 28 May 1903. Granted Good Service Pay of £13 p.a. – 7 October 1905.</i></p> <p><i>Commended without record for good police services in a case of a dangerous assault – 18 August 1910. Highly commended without record – Good Police Duty - Strike on the West & South Clare Railway – 18 April 1911.</i></p> <p><i>Discharged on a provisional pension of £303.3s.6d. from 16/7/1921 as a result of an accidental injury at Belfast on 19/3/1919.</i></p> <p><i>Pension increased to £433.6s.8d. p.a. from 1/4/1922 in accordance with RIC Pensions (Supplemental) (No.2) Order 1922.</i></p>
