SURGEON-CAPTAIN E. R. TOWNSEND.

Surgeon-Captain Evelyn Richard Townsend, R.N., retired, died at Alverstone on Tuesday, aged forty-seven. He was known as the inventor of the device for testing air in underwater craft. The method is now generally adopted in the submarine service. Captain Townsend had been ailing for some time as the result of an abscess on the lung, but the end came suddenly. A son of the late Dr. Edward Townsend, of Cork, he saw service in the South African War and the Great War.
